


Solid Waste Management

PERÚ

- The Ministry of Environment through the “Program for the Development of Solid Waste Management in Priority Zones” has achieved the viability of 31 projects to improve solid waste management in the coastal, jungle and mountain zone in Peru.
- 14 have been declared viable and 16 are still under evaluation and others under formulation.
- The program looks to minimize waste generation, through education, increase in quality and coverage of transport and selective collection of waste in order to reduce, reuse and recycle them and adding value to organics through activities like composting. Additionally the construction of 31 landfills is planned to receive non-reusable material.
- One of the weakest points of Peru’s is the lack of landfills since today only eight landfills exist, three of them in Lima, the capital. The landfill disposal is only of 30% and the remaining is directly disposed of into the environment.
- The goal is for Peru to have 100% of waste adequately managed in 2010 (Plan Nacional de Acción Ambiental – PLANAA PERÚ 2010-2021).
- Financing from JICA, BID and Ministry of Environment of Peru. has and will be vital to accomplish those goals.
